A Note from the Director

Dear Friends in Christ,

There is nothing like robust, exuberant, Spirit-filled hymn singing to bring tears of joy to an organist. As I began to plan my remarks for tonight's dinner, I was reminded of the deep impact of congregational hymns in my own life.

I grew up singing and playing hymns. "How Great Thou Art," "Are Ye Able," "Be Thou My Vision," and "For All the Saints," were family favorites. Spirit-filled family hymn singing on Sunday afternoons in the Addington household was not uncommon. Playing hymns is the most treasured and pleasing part of my church work and something that I have cherished sharing with each congregation I have served.

In a recent article, Alfred Fedak said "when it comes to our hymn singing, God deserves our very best. There's no room for a casual or haphazard approach to music in the church. Which is not to say that the church's music all

need be difficult or classical or whatever. In fact, there can be excellence in any genre. All of the church's musical leadership, including the choir if there is one, should be well-trained and well-prepared."


