Prior to coming to SIUMC, Justin maintained an active career in community and professional theatre. He has served as Musical Director and played piano in the orchestra for many shows, including *Guys and Dolls, Cats, My Fair Lady, Annie, Fiddler on the Roof, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Cabaret, Carousel, Smoke on the Mountain, Chitty Chitty, Bang, Bang, The King and I,* and *Nunsense*. From 2003 to 2009 Justin also served as staff Music Director for the professional traveling troupe *Downstage Centre*. Justin received a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Limestone College, and a Master's Degree in Church Music from Concordia University Wisconsin. He is currently pursuing a Doctorate Degree in Worship Studies from the Robert E. Webber Institute.

Evan Goetz (Stage Director) has worked with theatrical organizations such as Savannah Stage Company, Armstrong Masquers, Savannah Children's Theatre, Serenbe Playhouse, SCAD, Limestone College, Gaffney Little Theatre, and Carolina Actors Studio Theatre. Favorite roles include: Puck in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Paul in Barefoot in the Park, Lefou in Beauty and the Beast, Ernst in Spring Awakening, Don John in Much Ado About Nothing, and Gideon in Seven Brides for Seven Brothers. Evan has also received two Kennedy Center (Irene Ryan) nominations for his roles in Barefoot in the Park and Beauty and the Beast. His directing credits include Smoke on the Mountain, H.M.S. Pinafore, The King and I, Spooky Dog and the Teen-Age Gang Mysteries, The Women of Troy, and Robin Hood, Evan received his B.A. from Limestone College in South Carolina and his M.F.A. from Savannah College of Art and Design. He currently works at Armstrong State University as the Arts Marketing Director for the Department of Art, Music and Theatre as well as the Creative Director for Savannah Stage Company, Savannah's only non-profit professional theatre. Evan is a member of the Skidaway Island United Methodist Church Chancel Choir, and is super-excited to be working with such amazing artists!

Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II (Composer and Lyricist) were an influential, innovative and successful American musical theatre writing team. They created a string of popular Broadway musicals in the 1940s and 1950s, initiating what is considered the "golden age" of musical theatre. Their shows Oklahoma!, Carousel, South Pacific, The King and I, State Fair, Flower Drum Song and The Sound of Music, were outstanding successes. Among the many accolades they garnered were thirty-four Tony Awards, fifteen Academy Awards, two Grammy Awards and the Pulitzer Prize.


