

Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows" in Latin, is a solemn service traditionally observed during Holy Week, often on Good Friday or the evening before. It is a time of reflection on the suffering and death of Christ. Through a series of scripture readings, prayers, and the gradual extinguishing of candles, the service moves from light into darkness—symbolizing the abandonment and death of Jesus, and the seeming silence of God. Tenebrae invites us into the mystery of the cross with reverence, silence, and expectation.

Chorale preludes are musical meditations rooted in the rich tradition of Lutheran worship. Originally composed as organ settings of hymn tunes, these pieces were designed to introduce or reflect upon the chorale (or hymn) sung by the congregation. Often built around a familiar melody, the chorale prelude weaves intricate harmonies and expressive counterpoint around the tune, offering listeners a deeper encounter with the theological and emotional depth of the hymn text. From the reverent simplicity of early settings to the masterful works of composers like J.S. Bach, chorale preludes invite the heart and mind to engage prayerfully with the truths of the faith through sound.
