Program Notes

Robert Shaw (1916-1999) was an American composer and conductor. During his career, he transformed choral conducting into an art and set the standard of excellence for choral music in the USA. Shaw formed the Robert Shaw Chorale in 1948 in New York City and in 1967 went on to serve as musical director of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. The Robert Shaw Chorale gave many memorable concerts and made numerous recordings. Robert Shaw and his Chorale made the first classical recording to sell over one million copies and they received numerous citations, including several Grammy awards. In fact, Shaw, with his Chorale and other choral groups, was awarded 14 Grammys during his career.

"The Many Moods of Christmas" consists of eighteen Christmas carols grouped into four suites. The carols were arranged by famed Broadway orchestrator Robert Russell Bennett. The original version of "The Many Moods of Christmas," conducted by Shaw and performed by the Robert Shaw Chorale and RCA Victor Symphony, was released by RCA Victor in 1963. The album was a great success, with first-year sales exceeding 100,000, even as the then-recent assassination of President John F. Kennedy, which had occurred on November 22, 1963, cast a pall over Christmas for many Americans that year. In 1971, chorus/piano octavos were published by Lawson-Gould and the work quickly became a popular staple for church and community choirs.
