BIOGRAPHY

Justin L. Addington is the new Director of Music and Organist at St. John's United Methodist Church in Rock Hill, SC. Prior to coming to St. John's, Justin served for seven years as Director of Music and Worship at Skidaway Island United Methodist Church in Savannah, Georgia. Highlights of his ministry at SIUMC include the development of a nationally recognized concert series, performances of numerous major works with orchestra, and choir tours to Italy, Austria, and Carnegie Hall. Justin also labored to establish SIUMC's reputation in the area for high quality music and traditional worship.

Originally from Cowpens, South Carolina, Justin received a Bachelors of Arts (cum laude) in Music Education/Vocal Performance from Limestone College. In 2014 he was named the college's Young Alumnus of the Year, and in 2016 he was invited to be a featured organist on the college's concert schedule. Justin received a Master of Church Music in Choral Conducting from Concordia University Wisconsin. His master's thesis was entitled, "Handel's Messiah: A Historic Approach for the Church Choir." Justin is currently pursuing a Doctorate of Theology in Worship/Liturgy from the Robert E. Webber Institute in Jacksonville, Florida.

Justin is a life-long United Methodist, and a frequent lecturer on the hymns of Charles Wesley and the worship traditions of the United Methodist Church. He is a member of the Fellowship of United Methodist Musicians, the Hymn Society of America, the Handbell Musicians of America, and the American Guild of Organists, having served as Sub-Dean of the Spartanburg Chapter and Dean of the Savannah Chapter. In addition to his 17 years as a church musician, Justin has also taught music in the public schools, served as a board member for several non-profit arts organizations, and worked as a musical director/pianist for numerous semi-professional and community theaters.
