

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Dr. Justin L. Addington is the Minister of Music & Organist at First Baptist Church of Savannah. Originally from Cowpens, South Carolina, Justin holds a Bachelors of Arts in Music Education from Limestone College, a Masters of Sacred Music in Choral Conducting from Concordia University Wisconsin, and a Doctorate of Theology in Worship Studies from the Robert E. Webber Institute. He studied organ with Dr. Leon Couch and Brian Dailey. Justin is a member of the American Guild of Organists, serving as dean of the Savannah Chapter from 2012 to 2014. In addition to his work as a church musician, Justin has taught music in the public schools, served as a board member for several non-profit arts organizations, and worked as an actor and musical director/pianist for numerous semi-professional and community theater companies.

Rev. James C. Richardson, AAGO, is Organist *Emeritus* of First Baptist Church Savannah, having served as Minister for Worship and Fine Arts as well as Organist and Music Director from 1971 through 2012. He returned in an interim capacity from 2019 through 2021. He received a Bachelor of Music degree in Church Music, magna cum laude, from Mars Hill College (now University) in Mars Hill, North Carolina, and a Master of Church Music degree and Performer's Certificate from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He studied organ at Mars Hill with Donna Robertson, and at Southern Seminary with James Good and Donald Hustad. James has served as Dean of the Savannah Chapter AGO on four separate occasions. He was ordained by the First Baptist Church of Savannah in 1978, and is presently serving his first term on their Diaconate.
